We are excited to invite the Class of 2028 to apply to be members of Cardinals Interact. Our program is a partnership between Price Philanthropies Foundation, San Diego Rotary Club and Hoover High School. Our mission is to empower Hoover High School students to be leaders who achieve their maximum academic and personal potential. Over the past 20 years, we have witnessed over one thousand students benefit from the transformative Cardinals Interact experience.

In the program, we will support you as you work to achieve your academic and personal goals. We will explore careers you are curious about in the San Diego region. We will also work together to serve others as giving back to our community is an important part of being in Cardinals Interact. One of your most important highlights will be making new friends who will be with you throughout the program.

In the first year, students begin with a <u>mandatory</u> parent orientation and first year camp. These events will be followed by programs that help you develop strong friendships amongst your Cardinals Interact cohort and explore your values, interests, and goals. We also require Cardinals to attend our Academic Center one day a week after school. Your second year will include a multi-day trip to a college campus and visits to local businesses, public organizations, and universities so you can learn about different education and career opportunities. In your final year, you will go to third year camp and continue to explore careers. We also offer support with college applications and help you strengthen critical skills to prepare for the workforce and life after high school. In addition, every year we offer opportunities to participate in Rotary programs like Camp Enterprise and the International Youth Exchange.

Students who successfully complete the entire program are awarded a one-time scholarship of **\$1,000** for a post-secondary education institution.

To **<u>qualify</u>** for the program, students need to:

- Be a 9th grader, attending and planning to graduate from Hoover High School.
- Maintain good attendance and citizenship at school and in the program.
- Have a desire to maintain good grades and/or improve academically-
 - You must have at least a 1.0 grade point average (GPA) to qualify for the program. Once in the program, students are expected to improve towards at least a 2.0GPA.
- Be available to attend scheduled activities; and
- Have a desire to make personal improvements, be motivated and open-minded.

Application Process

- Students must submit a completed application, including a letter of recommendation.
- From the applications, we will select about 100 students to interview on a scheduled date.
- 50 students will be selected from the students who are interviewed.

The Aaron Price Fellows Program is looking for 40 exceptional students for our Class of 2028. The mission of our program is to prepare highly motivated and diverse San Diego public high school students to be responsible, engaged and caring members of their community.

Fellows participate in an incredible three-year journey. The journey begins the summer prior to sophomore year at a week-long away camp where bonding and friendships start to form. Throughout the following year, Fellows visit non-profit and cultural organizations to learn about career opportunities and their role in our community. During the second summer, Fellows take a multi-day trip to continue learning about important issues and build the bonds of friendship. Throughout their junior year of high school, they learn about local and state government and attend programs on important topics such as juvenile justice. Fellows begin the third year of the program with a June trip to Washington, DC where they meet with elected officials, tour important sites and learn about the federal government. Fellows then continue to attend local programs about national issues and leading industries during their senior year. They also receive support with college admissions.

To qualify for the program, students must:

- Be a 9th grade student at one of the six participating high schools (Hoover, Lincoln, Point Loma, Morse, San Diego, or University City)
- Have a minimum 3.0 GPA
- Be available to attend monthly programs, typically scheduled on Saturdays and during school holidays
- Have diverse interests and experiences
- Have a strong desire to learn and grow, and a positive outlook on life
- Demonstrate strong verbal and written communication skills
- Plan to attend college
- Be willing to share their experiences and opinions during discussions and in written reflections

Application Process:

- January 2, 2025 Applications are available online at <u>www.aaronpricefellows.org</u>. If applicants have limited internet access, a printed copy can be obtained at the school counseling office or request one from our office.
- February 11, 2025 Applications are completed and submitted online.
 - Printed copies can be submitted to the counseling center by 3pm or postmarked on February 11, 2025.
 - Teacher or administrator must submit letter of recommendation.
- Mid-March 2025 Approximately 80 students will move forward to an interview.
- April 2025 Approximately 40 students will be invited to join our Class of 2028.
